Driver of Change

With the amount of food imports from outside the city being as high as 96%, Bandung City established in 2020 the Buruan SAE programme to improve urban food security

MAIN ACTIVITIES

Using underutilised public lands & unproductive yards for urban gardening purposes

Managed by the communities, which currently has 335 spots spread over the city

Serving as a social gathering place for the other community activities

- additional experts to perform continuous training for the Buruan SAE communities
